\Rightarrow Year 1 Class Teacher Interviews ~ 7/2/18

We have successfully shortlisted 5 candidates for the permanent Year 1 teacher post. Interviews will take place on Wednesday 7th February; candidates will be observed teaching a phonics session, meeting our school Council and have a formal interview with Staff and Governors.

⇒ <u>Caretaker Interviews</u>

We had one candidate shortlisted to meet with us for the Caretaker post. Unfortunately, they were not able to attend and so we remain Caretaker-less! If you know anyone who may be interested in this role which is 2pm-5pm from Monday-Friday, please let us know.

⇒ Parking Policy Overview

In our most recent Health and Safety Governors' meeting, Governors discussed the implementation of a Parking Policy to help manage traffic on the school site and to ensure the safety of our pupils and other visitors to the school. We will be contacting a specialist company to offer further advice about adequate marking and car park accessibility but Governors discussed the introduction of a taxi bay, an additional disabled parking space, a permit system for blue badge holders, and the potential for an external company to fine visitors who park on our school site without permission or in disregard to the school's health and safety policies. Once we have taken advice from this company, we will provide further information as to the management of our school car park.

On Tuesday our Netball team played against St Dennis on a very wet, windy and cold afternoon. Unfortunately we lost the game but Ava scored two wonderful and skilful goals. Well done to our team as they worked extremely hard in rough weather conditions.
