

History:

We will be looking at the stone age to the iron age this term. We will look at artifacts, Stonehenge and Skara Brae and learn about Mary Anning.



- Mary Anning is an English paleontologist.

- Skara Brae is a one of Britain's most fascinating prehistoric villages.

Science:

This term children will learn all about rocks and soils. We will compare and group together different kinds of rocks (including those in the locality) on the basis of appearance and simple physical properties and describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.


Reading:
