If you have any questions about Free School Meals, please speak with Miss Dash in the Office who can answer your question or refer you to the Free School Meals Team. We also have not received everyone's reply to the letter sent home requesting information on your child's country of birth and nationality. Although you can refuse this request, we still need the slip back to acknowledge that you received the request. There is an option on the slip indicating refusal. Please do ensure that you complete this slip and return it by Monday 16th January.
