Karslake— **Kadie Williams** for being an excellent role model to the other children on her table.


Melbur— **Lauren Bates** for her sensible attitude in class this week and making the right decisions.

⇒ School Emergency Closure Procedure

As we head towards Christmas, the weather has definitely taken an icy turn and we want to make all parents/ carers aware of the procedure for emergency school closure. If there is any concern regarding the weather affecting the health and safety of pupils while they are at school due to poor weather conditions, including the effects of snow, flooding, or no water or heating, a risk assessment will be undertaken. Where the risk to child's health and safety is deemed to be unacceptable, the school will be closed. This could happen before or during the school day. We aim to inform families of our closure as soon as possible. Once the governing board authorise the decision to close we would then notify the council and 3 local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Heart FM and Pirate FM) who will then broadcast the details of the school closure. We will also notify all parents via the eschools app, text message and we will put up an important notice banner on our school website. It is vital that all families are aware of this plan to minimise any potential risk in either bringing children to school and then having to take them home again in poor weather conditions or to ensure timely collection. We would encourage you to listen to the radio, check the school website or the app for messages rather than contact the school directly as lines are likely to be busy and need to be kept clear in the event of an emergency.

KS1 Christmas Production Reminders

Letters and tickets for the KS1 Christmas production went home this week. This years performance is called 'Born in a Barn' and the children have been practising so hard to give families a spectacular performance. This year there will be 3 performances: Tuesday 6th December at 2pm (for the whole school, children from Nanpean Nippers, and parents/ family members with young children), Wednesday 7th December at 5.30pm, and Thursday 8th December at 2pm. A limited number of additional tickets are available upon request. If you do not need as many tickets as have been provided, please do return them to school as we can then redistribute them to ensure that as many people can attend as fire regulations allow!

A quick reminder that parents of children born between 1st September 2012 and 31st August 2013 must apply for a primary school place for September 2017. The deadline for applications is **midnight on 15th January 2017**, which is not that far away! Applications can be made online at www.cornwall.gov.uk/ admissions or you can request a paper copy by calling 0300 1234 100. If applications are not received by the deadline, it is likely that you will not get a place at your child's preferred school as places in the locality are filling up fast!


⇒ Lost Property

⇒ Chicken Pox

We have had a few cases of chicken pox this week so please look out for any symptoms your child may show that indicate chicken pox: feeling tired and generally unwell, a high temperature (fever) of 38C (100.4F) or over, feeling sick, a headache, aching, painful muscles or loss of appetite and of course the rash. Chicken Pox is highly contagious and can make some people very unwell, so it is important to avoid spreading it to others. If your child displays any concerning symptoms, please keep them at home and speak with your child's doctor. If they do not have chicken pox, they can be brought into school later, if they do then guidance recommends that they stay off school until they are not contagious (this could take a week).
