Introduction

At Nanpean Community Primary School we believe Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding for 2 years to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. 'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013). We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, greater opportunities for sporting competitions, variety of after school clubs and holiday clubs for all our young people.

Sport Premium Grant (SPG)

Allocations for the academic year 2015/16 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2015 Census, as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil; and
- Schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils receive £500 per eligible pupil.

The Sport Premium Grant for 2015/16 is funded over two instalments as follows:

Objectives

At Nanpean Community Primary School we have targeted three key areas:

- Healthy Active Lifestyles

Summary of spending for 2015/16

- Hiring sports coaches (Go Active) to provide CPD for teachers £5,400
- Providing a variety of after-school sports clubs (football, netball, tag rugby, multiskills, gymnastics, street surfing, dance, kwick cricket and athletics) - £1,260
- Offering holiday clubs at affordable rates £600
- Providing resources for PE and sport (netball and football posts) £990
- Providing training courses in PE and sport £250
- Sport competitions with local schools (football, netball, tag rugby, Snell Cup, kwick cricket) - £555
- Participating in the Clay League to extend the variety of competitive sports (athletics, swimming) - £77
- Healthy Schools Annual Audit and training for our PSHE subject leader and lunchtime supervisors - £150
- Trophies for sports groups £194

Outcomes

- ✓ Teachers more confident at delivering high quality PE lessons for our children.
- ✓ The number of sports clubs available to children has increased from 2 to 6.
- ✓ Participation in sports clubs has increased from 21 children in Summer 2015 to 124 in Summer 2016.
- ✓ Attendance at each Holiday Club has increased from 20 to 25 children.
- ✓ Increased opportunities for children to compete in local area tournaments and festivals for a variety of different sports (e.g. football, netball, tag rugby, Snell Cup, kwick cricket, athletics, swimming).
- ✓ Increased opportunities for Professional Development events for our PE Lead.
- ✓ Healthy Schools Status re-accredited.
- ✓ Reduction in behaviour incidents at lunchtimes.
- ✓ Pupil attendance has improved from 96.1% in 2014/15 to 96.8% in 2015/16.
- √ 4 persistent absentees (>10%) in 2015/16; all were only just under 90%.
