We will compare and contrast the tourism opportunities that are offered in Cornwall compared to Egypt.

WRITING:

We will be using the silent film 'Alma' as a stimulus to our writing. We will write our own suspense stories based on this model. Following this, we will write newspaper reports about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb . Also, we will read Egyptian myths and legends and write our own. Finally, we will write persuasive leaflets based on visiting Egypt/exhibitions.

READING:

We will continue to develop our comprehension skills (Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval and Summary). We will look at a variety of picture books including 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan and poetry from the book 'The Lost Words' by Jackie Morris and Robert Macfarlane. Our class novel will be 'Holes' by Louis Sachar. Excitingly, we will be going to the theatre to watch the stage production too.

GRAMMAR/PUNCTUATION:

We will be revising grammatical skills and knowledge from across KS2. Also, we will use the subjunctive form in formal writing and use the perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time and cause.

SPELLING:

Our spelling will focus on homophones and near homophones as well as securing the common words on the year 5/6 list as detailed in the National Curriculum. Also, we will investigate the origin of words in the English language.

HANDWRITING:

Year 6 will be revising our joins to write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.

HISTORY

We will be learning about who the Ancient Egyptians were and what life was like during this time. We will investigate the mummification processes and why this was important to the Egyptians. Also, we will learn about the life of the pharaoh Tutankhamun and the discovery of his tomb by Howard Carter. Finally, we will compare and contrast the powers of different Egyptian gods.

Vocabulary: Pharaoh, Great Pyramid, Sphinx, Tutankhamen, mummification, organs, sarcophagus, sources, versions of events

<u>GEOGRAPHY</u>

We will explore the human and physical geography of modern day Egypt and the UK. Also, we will research the country as a holiday destination.

Vocabulary: physical features, human features, climate zones, tourism, geographical, similarities, differences, economic activity, natural re-

ART

We will improve mastery of drawing techniques by drawing faces in pencil and charcoal in our sketch book. Following this, we will design masks in the context of the artist Man Ray. These will then be made into models using papier mache.

Vocabulary: sketch, details, technique, artists, designers, sculpt, model,

Science

Animal including Humans

We will learn to identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. Also, we will recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function. Finally, we will describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

<u>Vocabulary:</u> circulatory system, veins, arteries, capillaries, lungs, heart, kidneys, liver, blood, platelets, aorta, ventricles,

PSHE

Drugs, alcohol and tobacco education

During this unit, we will understand the effects, risks and laws relating to cannabis and the effect it can have on your health. Also, we will understand the risk of volatile substance abuse and where to get and give advice.

Vocabulary: cannabis, volatile, substances, inhaling, emergency

Relationship and Sex Education

This term, we will be learning about puberty and reproduction. We will describe how the body changes in preparation for reproduction. As well as this, we will discuss different types of adult relationships and explain how babies are made. Finally, we will describe the decisions that have to be made before having a baby.

<u>Vocabulary:</u> womb, sperm, egg, conception, fertilisation, pregnancy, sexual intercourse, twins, fostering, adoption, relationship, friendship, love, consent, intimacy.

Computing/esafety

We will use Publisher to create our own brochures to advertise tourism in Cornwall and Egypt. We will use search technologies effectively to appreciate how results are selected and ranked.

Final Product: the children will use green screen technology to make their own tourism programme which will be available to view on the school website.
