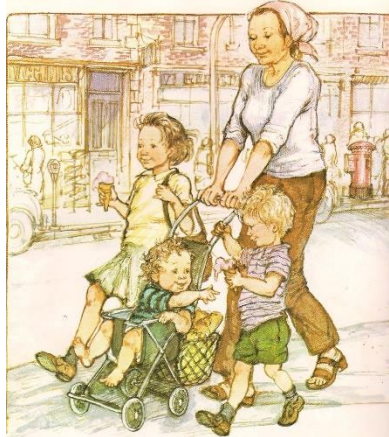

## VOCABULARY (Subject Specific)

Present tense	A sentence that is happening now.
Full stop	Use to show the end of a sentence.
Capital letter	For names of people, places and days of the week.
Simple sentence	Has a subject and a verb. Who o what? Doing?
Teacher will assess children's knowledge and understanding of vocabulary specific to the text.	



## Year 1 National Curriculum Statements

Write sentences by:

- saying out loud what they are going to write about
- composing a sentence orally before writing it
- sequencing sentences to form short narratives
- re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense
- discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils
- read aloud their writing clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.

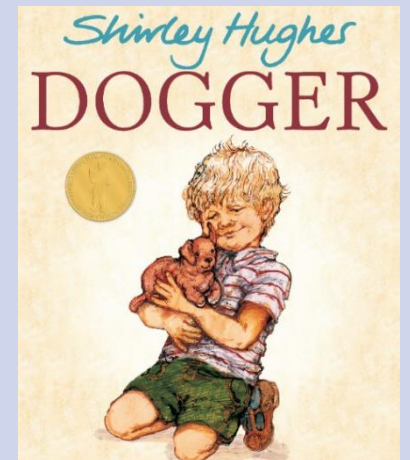
Develop their understanding of the concepts set out in English Appendix 2 by:
