⇒ Anti-Bullying Policy & Procedures

Bullying, in any form, is not tolerated at our school. We are committed to the creation of a positive and safe learning environment where all members of the school community feel valued, respected, are treated equally and are able to come to school without fear. At Nanpean School, we define bullying as an abuse of power by one or more people through repeated hurtful or aggressive behaviour with the intention to cause emotional or physical harm to another person. In the event that bullying of one person is either noted by staff or reported to school by another person, the same procedures will be followed as for all other incidents of poor behaviour: staff will firstly gather evidence and the details of the incident and any subsequent action taken will be recorded. If it is a serious incident, temporary or permanent exclusion will be considered after a full review of the facts. Bullying incidents will be logged in Mrs Wicks' behaviour folder and more serious incidents will be reported formally to the Local Authority. Parents/ carers of both parties will be kept informed at all stages. Our school's Anti-Bullying Policy and any associated policies, such as our Behaviour and Discipline policy and e-Safety policy applies to all pupils at the school. A designated Governor is responsible for maintaining an overview of behavioural and bullying issues. Any parent/ carer who is dissatisfied with the way the school has dealt with a bullying incident can ask the Chair of Governors to look into the matter. The Governing Board will investigate and respond within ten days and will inform the Head Teacher who will assist with the case. Last week we reported the proposals for repurposing the Church Rooms. The Parish Council has received a proposal to take the



Church Rooms from a neglected former Sunday School to a convenience store, which will include a free cash point, hot food to go, coffee machine, alcohol and cigarette sales, pay point services and parcel deliveries/collections. This proposal means that some of

the building would remain under the management of the Parish Council and these rooms would be available for community use/ events. The development of the Church Rooms into a useful community resource would be invaluable to our community but it is important that the new use of the Church Rooms is something that our community needs.
