New Reception Admissions Deadline - 15/02/18


Please note that the deadline to apply for a school place in September 2018 is **15th February.** Applications must be made to Cornwall Council using their online form. If you do not have access to the internet, you can contact the Admissions team on 0300 1234 101 to request a paper one, or you can ask at the office, you can print you off a paper copy. We are aware that this date is during half term but your application must be received by that date.

⇒ Half Term Holiday Club ~ 16/02/18

Following the success of our last Holiday club, we are running another Half Term Holiday Club on **Friday 16th February.** The club will run from 9am to 3pm and costs just £5 for the day. Children need to wear suitable clothing for arts, crafts and baking, and must bring a waterproof coat, and outdoor shoes or wellies. Children also need to bring a packed lunch, a midmorning snack and plenty to drink throughout the day. Mrs Varney, Miss Rosevear and Mrs Wade will be leading the day and have planned a host of fun activities.

⇒ School Closure Reminder

Some of you may have noticed the adverse weather this week which this caused some very dangerous travel conditions. We had numerous phone calls checking to see if the school was open and we want to remind all parents to refrain from doing this. The decision to close the school at any time will be made by the Headteacher. We will inform the local authority and Pirate FM, who will broadcast the closure on the radio and on their website. We will also send a text out to all parents informing them that the school will be closed and we will put a notification banner on the main page of our website. Staff have access to all these formats from home if they are not able to get to site themselves. Please check these sources if you are concerned that the school may be closed, if there are no indications on any of these sites, then you can safely presume that the school is open. Please do not call the school to check if it is open, we need to keep the phone lines and staff free to manage the situation. We understand that in treacherous conditions, the majority of children may not be able to get into school safely, and we appreciate that the normal procedure is to call the school to let us know that your child won't be attending school. However, in exceptional circumstances, such as extreme weather, this is not required on the day. We will follow up with a slip confirming that your child was absent due to the snow in the days following this. However, we would also like to remind parents that we expect children to be brought into school when conditions have cleared up, as they did on Tuesday when road conditions returned to near normal before lunch. Slips were sent home yesterday so please return these by Monday 19th February to confirm the reason for your child's absence.



Governors met with the Local Authority this week to plan the headteacher interview process taking place next half term. The advert for a new headteacher will be live from today and will remain open until Monday 5th March. The interviews will take place on Wednesday 21st March and Thursday 22nd March. To ensure that parents/carers are involved in this process, we will be holding a meet and greet with shortlisted candidates on Wednesday 21st March from 2.30pm.
