Hendra— Rianon Kinch for having a great attitude for learning and following instructions with thought and care.

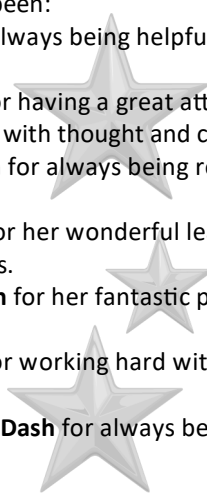
Prosper— Stacey Ridgeon for always being ready to learn and doing her best.
