Prosper— **Matilda Rushton** for always putting 100% effort into everything she does.


Karslake— Ava Bottery for exceeding in maths, English and reading this week and writing a fantastic advert.

Class teachers will release all children from usual end of day exits to permitted adults at 1.25pm and the Hall doors will open for the Christmas Fair at 1.30pm.
