Prosper - Ciaran for showing great responsibility and enthusiasm during play rehearsal


Karslake - Jacob for working hard during Maths this week.

Attendance/Lateness

Letters are being sent out to Parents this week whereby our monitoring shows poor attendance or persistent lateness. The expectation is that children are in school every day, except when they are quite poorly, and the Government expectation is for children's attendance to be above 96%. In terms of lateness, we have a few children who are late for school quite often. We hope that this improves and decreases as this has an impact on children's learning: the start of the day is extremely important with Phonics and Reading being taught at this time. This is also disruptive to the learning of others when children arrive late to their classroom.
