With the latest media coverage surrounding illnesses lately, we also wanted to remind parents as to the correct procedure for staff administering medicine. All medicine must be handed in via the school office as there are consent forms that must be completed and signed prior to us being able to administer medicine, this includes medication for conditions that require regular treatment, such as asthma or allergies. All medication must be prescribed by a doctor for your child. If you would like your child to have Calpol or similar medication that is generally not prescribed by a doctor, then you are able to come in and administer this to your child yourself.
