# HEAD TEACHER WEEKLY UPDATE

This week has been an extremely busy week for me as I have been transporting children from different classes to various events (including Year 5 to their weekly sailing session but also please see information elsewhere on the Newsletter).

Despite this, I have also continued to focus on supporting children and families, as well as ensuring we continue to progress in relation to school improvement priorities. As part of this, we welcomed a Local Authority Curriculum Advisor (Mark Corbett) into school on Monday and

Mark worked with all Teachers in their role as Subject Leaders with a focus on continual development of their subject(s) within the Curriculum. I have known Mark for a long time and am grateful for his support with this. To enable meetings to take place with Mark, I taught Year 5 (Drinnick Class) their Maths lesson, related to place value, and I was impressed by their knowledge. I also taught Year 2 (Prosper Class) their Art session, in relation to Frottage. On Tuesday, I met with other Headteachers from the local cluster, about events being offered to the cluster of schools, including those being offered through Brannel. This was a positive meeting and some exciting ideas were discussed for the future. I then took our Year 5 children to their sailing session. Due to the weather conditions not being appropriate for sailing, the children did body-boarding this week, which they enjoyed despite the rain! I did point out to them that they

were wet from the sea water anyway so the rain didn't make much difference! On Wednesday, one of our Governors visited school as part of our Governor Monitoring arrangements for this term. Mark Tucker met with me to discuss and review Behaviour and Safeguarding, and procedures in relation to these. This was a positive meeting, and Mark will now also share information with other Governors.

In the afternoon, I transported Year 6 to their Junior Life Skills session (see information elsewhere on the Newsletter).

On Thursday evening, it was fantastic to be able to offer a Fundraising Event again, with us holding a Bingo evening, proceeds of which are going to Year 6 Leavers Celebrations. I really enjoyed taking part in this and would like to thank Mrs Houston for organising this, as well as Jo and Ian Whitford for offering to run the Bingo, Adrian Warne for calling on the day and Year 6 Staff and children for their donations. Now Covid-19 restrictions aren't in place I look forward to us being able to offer further Community events in future.
