#### **EDEN CLASS**

Eden class had an amazing visit to Lanjeth Water Gardens this week. We loved exploring their woodland and the many lakes and ponds. #### **HENDRA CLASS**

We have been looking at Pablo Picasso's portraits in our Art lessons this term. We have looked at the shapes within his work as well as the colours he used.

#### **MELBUR CLASS**

We have had a wonderful week in Melbur class this week. In maths we have been practising sharing and grouping as part of our new multiplication and division unit. In English we have been making up our own fairy tale villains and bringing them to life with the backdrop of spooky music! The children have been working really well in Spanish and can even sing a song - do ask them what words they can say in Spanish they might just surprise you. In geography we learnt all about the volcanic eruption of Mount St Helens in the 1980's and in music we have been getting groovy with motifs. #### **DRINNICK CLASS**

This week in PE, Drinnick Class have been exploring balancing and counterbalances. This means learning how to hold their bodies steady and how to work with a partner to create balances together. Pupils have been practising strong body positions, using their core muscles, and discovering how to share weight safely. In counterbalances, they lean away from each other while staying connected, which helps them understand trust, teamwork, and how forces can be equal on both sides. The class have enjoyed experimenting with different shapes and levels, and they are becoming more confident, controlled, and creative in their movements.



#### **ROSEMELLYN CLASS**

This week, Rosemellyn have been so engrossed in their independent writing: a recount letter retelling Jonathan Harker's horrifying experiences of Count Dracula. They've worked hard to include a range of punctuation, archaic language of the time and detailed description through rich language choices.
